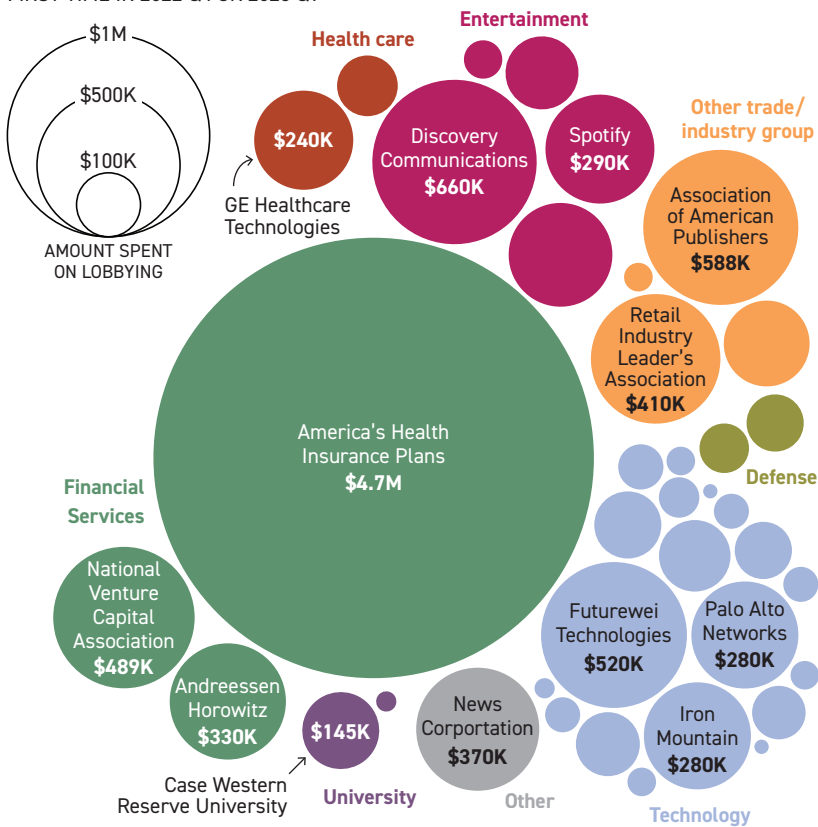
Companies leaping into AI lobbying fray

Amid increasing development and releases of artificial intelligence software, many groups in technology and other sectors have invested millions of dollars toward federal lobbying that includes artificial intelligence issues. Congress is weighing potential regulations on the emerging technology and held hearings on artificial intelligence in May.

In addition to technology giants like Meta, Google and Amazon, large industry groups such as the Chamber of Commerce, American Medical Association and Business Roundtable are also lobbying on AI issues. OpenAI, the creator of ChatGPT, has not yet registered to lobby, though it plans to hire a chief congressional lobbyist.

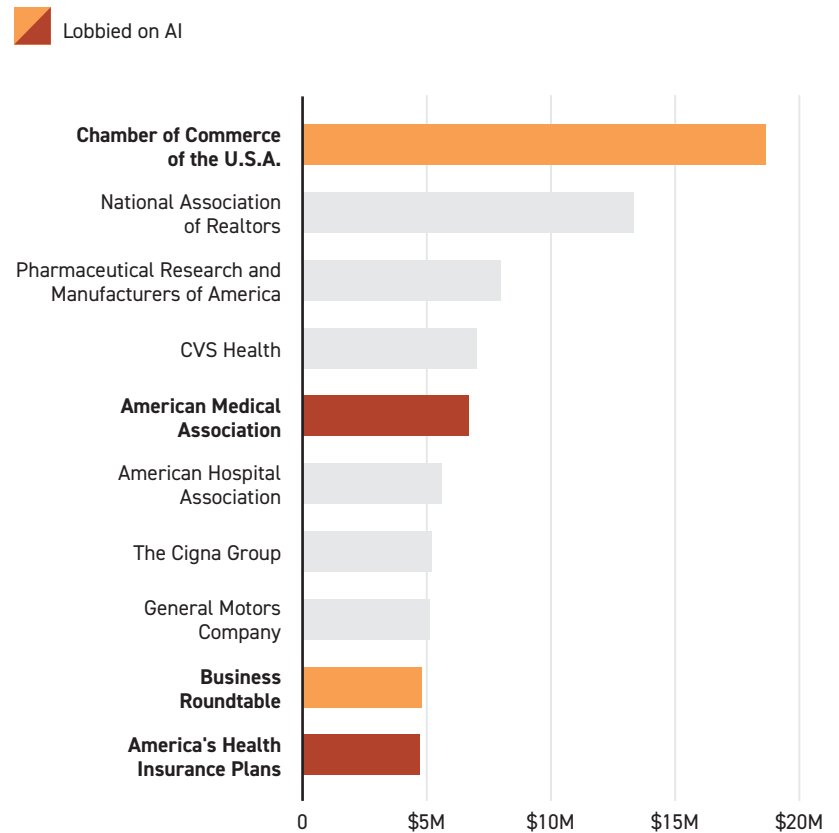
Over 30 groups started lobbying on AI in past two quarters
